

Famous Speech Vision Board

After you have researched your speech in depth, you will need to communicate your findings in a visual manner through a 'vision board'. A vision board is much more than a collage because you communicate the most important facts and ideas through the strategic selection of images and text.

Success Criteria:

- Include the date and title of the speech
- A dominant image of the speaker
- Minimum of 9 significant quotes that embody the Elements of Persuasive Speech
- Minimum of 9 images that relate to each of the quotes you include (literally and figuratively *equally weighted)
- Include Elements of Persuasive Speech terminology that describes the style of the Speech, next to the images and text chosen (Ethos, Metaphor, Exigence, etc.)
- Colours that reflect the tone/ mood
- Rough work is included (notes, chart, etc.)
- Uses a preferred choice of medium (In-Design, Photoshop, Publisher, Scrapbooking/Collage) that can be physically submitted (not digitally)
